Conference Speakers

Peggy Leonard, MS, RN-BC, NP, is the current Vice President for Clinical Services for a not-for-profit managed care organization where she procured and implemented a grant from NYS-DOH for pilot program for integrated care coordination. She is the immediate past president of the National Case Management Society, a member of the National Quality Forum Steering Committee for Care Coordination, member of the National Transition of Care Public Policy Task Force and a member of the New York State Board of Nursing. Peggy is known as a national leader in healthcare innovation playing a key role in all aspects of healthcare policy and practice

Davin Quinn, MD, is the Medical Director of Psychiatric Consultation Services at the University of New Mexico Hospital and as an Assistant Professor in the UNM Department of Psychiatry. He received his bachelor's degree in psychology from Princeton University and his medical degree from Harvard Medical School. He completed residency in psychiatry at Massachusetts General Hospital/Mclean Hospital and a fellowship in psychosomatic medicine at MGH. Dr. Quinn has published articles in several areas of consultation psychiatry, including substance abuse, neurobehavioral syndromes of brain injury, and adverse effects of psychotropic medications

Devon Neale, MD currently practices as a Geriatrician and Palliative Medicine physician as a member of the Palliative Care Inpatient Consult Team at UNMH. She attended Stanford University Medical School, completed an Internal Medicine Residency at UNM School of Medicine and a fellowship in Geriatrics and Palliative Medicine at the Mount Sinai School of Medicine. She is board certified in Internal Medicine, Geriatric Medicine and Palliative Care.

Lorerky Ramirez Moya, MD has recently completed her Psychiatric Fellowship in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at the University of New Mexico and will be joining the UNM faculty. She graduated from Central America Autonomous University in San Jose, Costa Rica, completed her General Psychiatry Residency at Bergen Regional Medical Center in New Jersey and a Psychiatric Fellowship in Child and Adolescent Psychiatry at the University of New Mexico. Her areas of interest include: developmental disorders, Native communities in the Americas, cultural awareness, infant psychiatry and the psychiatry of women.

Francine Olmstead, MD, FACP is the Medical Director for NM Travel Health and is one of a few thousand medical providers worldwide to have earned the Certificate of Knowledge in Travel Health administered by the International Society of Travel Medicine. Since 2001, Dr. Olmstead has sub-specialized in International Travel Medicine and has been providing consultative services to patients, medical professionals and companies regarding International Travel Health and Pandemic Planning and Awareness Education. Dr. Olmstead was invited to write an article, "The Traveling Patient" for the Journal of Urgent Care Medicine and presents across the nation on travel medicine. She earned her MD from the University of New Mexico School of Medicine, is board certified in Internal Medicine and a Fellow of the American College of Physicians. She serves as a volunteer medical director for various international trips associated with schools, nonprofit organizations and missionary programs throughout New Mexico and serves on the Board of Directors for the Albuquerque Hispano Chamber of Commerce.

Daniel Duhigg, DO currently practices in the UNM Multidisciplinary Pain Clinic focusing on the interface between pain management and addictions. Dr. Duhigg was born and raised in Albuquerque, NM. He attended medical school in Kansas City, MO, where he completed a dual-degree DO and MBA programs. He trained in psychiatry at The Ohio State University, and then completed a fellowship in Addiction Psychiatry at the University of New Mexico.

Shawn Baker, MD is currently practicing with the Presbyterian Medical Group Orthopedic team, focusing on sports medicine and care to the upper and lower extremities including joint replacement and trauma care. He previously served as Chief of Orthopedics at Kirtland Air Force Base in Albuquerque and most recently at Luke Air Force Base in Phoenix, Arizona. He is a decorated military officer and distinguished himself by providing expert surgical care to hundreds of combat casualties while deployed to Afghanistan. Dr. Baker completed his undergraduate degree at the University of Texas in Austin, graduated with honors from Texas Tech Medical School and completed his Internship and Orthopedic Surgery Residency at the University of Texas Medical Branch in Galveston.

Troy Rodgers, Psy.D. is the Agency Director for Forensic Behavioral Health Associates LLC (FBHA), the Division Director for the Behavioral Sciences Division of the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department and a Staff Psychologist for the Albuquerque Police Department. He is currently an adjunct faculty member at Central New Mexico Community College, the Lead Faculty Member for the counseling and criminal justice departments at the Albuquerque Branch of the University of Phoenix and is certified as a Professional Lecturer by the New Mexico Department of Public Safety Training Academy. He is currently licensed in New Mexico as a Psychologist, School Psychologist, Professional Clinical Counselor, and school counselor and has been working in the mental health field for over ten years with particular areas of expertise that include school psychology, police psychology, law enforcement assessment, criminal treatment and evaluation, substance abuse, violence risk assessment, school and workplace violence, crisis intervention, behavioral profiling, peak performance training, and stalking. Dr. Rodgers has a master's degree and a doctorate in clinical forensic psychology from the University of Denver. Phoenix.
